The Message (Video)

After three long months, many of us who are able or who feel safe enough, are finally able to be together again. Even though the pandemic is far from over, with precautions we come together to celebrate being able to worship together again. After this long time we almost have to reintroduce ourselves. Through it all we have managed to endure the experience. Some may have even gotten use to the unique experience and adapted to the changes it brought about. This ability to adapt is valuable since we are told that this pandemic is far from being over.

There is little doubt that we have had to change our lifestyle, brought about by the restriction placed upon us. The sacrifices we have had to make in our lifestyle have had their effects upon how we now perceive life. As members of our society we have taken so much for granted. We have had the freedom to get in the car and go wherever we want, whenever we want without any restrictions. Whether it has been shopping, going to a restaurant, attending a sporting event or concert, traveling the world, or going to church that was never a problem for it was all there for us to personally experience. We had the freedom to do it all. The world was there to experience. Our perception of life was that the only limitations to life were those we placed upon ourselves or the wherewithal to experience it all.

All of that has now changed for the pandemic has affected us all. I am especially mindful of the sacrifices which our high school and college graduates have been forced to make. They were denied all the traditions of graduating. In all too many cases they were left alone without being able to see any family to comfort them.

Although living through sacrifice may have seemed to be overwhelming and even frightening at times we have come this far. For this we celebrate. In our celebration we now realize that life as

we knew it has definitely changed and will never be the same again. Perhaps we now will not take everything for granted and become a more grateful people for each other and the gifts of life; more grateful to be able to appreciate time to reflect and a slowed-down pace of life; more grateful to have the freedom to live out our lives without being fearful of the unknown; Hopefully our perception of life now will see that our sacrifices bring the awareness that every moment will bring new opportunities with new hopes and dreams.

We have all experienced sacrificing our life routines in one way or another. But this should not only bring a whole new meaning and purpose to life but the understanding that we have the strength and character to overcome major obstacles in life through God's presence. Paul in his letter to the Romans spoke of the suffering and persecution which the followers of Christ were experiencing. These words of Paul are so timely. .He first wrote about the hope they had because of their faith in God's grace of sharing His eternal love. Then he continues, "Not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

I have found that this statement to be true. It is through sacrifice and suffering that we discover who we are and the inner strength we have in order to overcome that which at times brings life to a standstill. We as a nation and world community are experiencing the same crisis in life. If we come to this realization it should bring us closer as brothers and sisters for we are sharing the same sacrifices and suffering from the same deadly invisible enemy. It should bring us to a greater realization of what love is about. This is a great opportunity to begin to realize that we all share the same life and have the same hopes and dreams no matter where we live or the language we speak or the color of our skin. We all have the same love of life for we are all children of God out of His love. We all have the same hope that this time of suffering and sacrifice will soon end. With this hope the scientific community throughout the world has been working tirelessly to find a way to defeat this invisible enemy of us all.

If we didn't have enough on our plates we have again come face to face with the reality of inequality and injustice which the black community has been suffering for generations. The cruel murdering of George Floyd by a Minneapolis policeman seen on video by the world adds to the crisis we are experiencing. Perhaps if we were not under restrictions of various kinds of quarantine this tragic incidence would regrettably only get fleeting attention. But being tied to the internet and the TV has visibly brought this long standing injustice and inequality to the attention of everybody. Hopefully it is a wakeup call that during this time of change we have

the endurance and commitment to live the Gospel of God's love to change this downfall of society

Perhaps the crisis of the pandemic is the tipping point to bring about a new awareness of others and their suffering which need not be. Our brothers and sisters need not live in fear out of injustice and inequality. This is the perfect time to turn the present health crisis and a crisis of injustice into the beginning of living and acting in the way God' love has shown us through the gospels. Hopefully the present health crisis and the crisis of injustice will direct us to begin to live and act in the way God's love.

Even though both crisis continues, and will continue, we celebrate the fact that we are able to be here today. Hopefully this is with the realization that together in God's love we will strive to fulfill the hope of a new and better world for all. It is together, alongside of our brothers and sisters throughout our nation and the world, that we will begin to realize "the peace of God which surpasses all understanding." Therefore today we celebrate the hope of the beginning of a new life free from covid19, hate, and prejudice. It is then that we will be able to truly proclaim with the Psalmist, "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all you lands! Serve the Lord with gladness; come into God's presence with a song. Know that the Lord is God, our maker, to whom we belong; we are God's people and the sheep of God's pasture."
