When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

## The Christmas Message (Video Link)

Recently I was scrolling Facebook when, just out of curiosity, I clicked onto a posted video. The video was a German ad with no voice commentary, for it needed none, just a musical background. The more I watched the more I became involved in the visual story which ended with a most meaningful message about Christmas, It was about an elderly man and his Christmas gift. I will take the liberty to make this ad into a tale as I imagine the complete story would be. For the purposes of this story I will give the elderly man the name of Ben.

Ben was retired and living alone after his wife had died. He remained in the house which he and his wife bought over 50 years ago. The house had many fond memories of raising his children and later spending many loving days with his wife. Ben in his younger years kept fit by frequently exercising but in recent years those days had long since passed and he found himself old and physically weak. One year, well after the cold months of winter, he determined to change all of that for he had a Christmas dream to fulfill.

He went out to his shed where he had stored items which he no longer used but just accumulated because he never was able to part with them. He began to search through the accumulated items. After moving many boxes and other items he finally saw what he was looking for in a far corner. It was a forty-five pound kettlebell which he had used in his younger years to exercise. (A kettlebell is a heavy iron ball with a handle attached to it and is use for exercising.)

He took hold of its handle but he could no longer lift it, so he had to drag it with both hands out of the shed. His neighbors heard the noise and looked to see what in the world old Ben was up to. They saw him trying again and again to lift the heavy kettlebell. At first he only managed to lift it an inch or two from the ground. In the meantime he began to take walks every day. At first the walks were rather short but then each week they became longer and longer and his legs became stronger and stronger. But the challenge of the kettlebell also continued. Day after day he would go through the laborious and painful task of trying to lift the weight, while his neighbors continue to be baffled with this old man's seemingly impossible task.

Days turned into weeks and weeks into months. Gradually he was able to lift the weight to his knees, then to his waste, then to his chest then finally he was able to lift it over his head. He still continued until he was able to comfortably hold it high above his head. But his neighbors still were baffled why all of a sudden this old man put himself through this most strenuous and painful activity.

Christmas Eve came and soon the mystery would be revealed. It was now time. He dressed in his finest, picked up a package which he had beautifully wrapped, and off he went. His destination was his daughter's family home. When he arrived his daughter was happy but seemed somewhat surprised to see him. Taking off his coat but still holding the package he hugged his small granddaughter who had rushed to his side. With a great big smile on his face he gave her the package. She quickly opened it finding a cherished family heirloom. Her eyes lit up when she saw a large shinning golden star which had always sat atop her grandparents Christmas tree.

But the story does not end there. He then picked up his granddaughter lifting her over his head so she could have the joy and memory of placing the star on top of her family tree for the first time. To give her the cherished star would take on far more meaning by giving her the cherished memory of being lifted up by her grandfather and placing the star atop the tree. He had spent those many months of hard, painful, and sacrificial work in order for his granddaughter to have that moment of joy. His Christmas gift of love was now fulfilled.

Ben's act of love vividly shows us that a gift alone does not mean it is a gift of love. A gift of love is when we give of ourselves, even to the point of sacrifice, in order to bring lasting joy and fulfillment to the recipient. Isn't this the story of Christmas and the message of the angels to those lowly shepherds that night long ago? "But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, [a] the Lord." This was the announcement of God's gift of love for us, the gift of Jesus. This is the truest gift of love for He gives of Himself so that our lives may be lifted up by knowing His love in our lives. God love lifts us up to be able to share and live this love among each other. It is the gift of love, through the birth of Jesus, which brings us peace and leads us to celebrate along with the heavenly host by proclaiming, "Glory be to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors."

My wish for you is that you be lifted up so as to let the light of God's love shine forth for all to see. This will then be a truly blessed and joyful Christmas for you.
